To all to whom these Presents shall come—GREETING: KNOW YE, That in conformity with a survey made on the seventeenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and fifty one, by virtue of said office treasury warrant, No. 14,569, there is granted by the said Commonwealth, unto Fredrick Reedy,

a certain Tract or Parcel of Land, containing twelve acres, lying and being in the County of Crayson, on the waters of Wilson's creek, situated as follows, viz: Beginning at a water oak in a line of said Reedy's patent land S. 8. E. 14 poles to a dogwood and chestnut saplings corner of John Duwall's land, and with Duwall's lines N. 83. W. 60 poles to a white oak; thence leaving Duwall's line North 96 poles to a white oak at or near a line of Duwall's land, and with said line East 34 poles to a white oak corner of said Reedy's land; thence leaving Duwall's lines, and with his own lines S. 42. W. 36 poles to a stake S. E. 40 poles to a chestnut tree at the foot of a hill S. 40. E. 30 poles to a chestnut tree on the side of a high ridge N. 83. E. 25 poles to the beginning with its appurtenances

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said Tract or Parcel of Land, with its appurtenances, to the said Fredrick Reedy and his heirs forever.
