E. 70 poles, capping a branch, to a white oak and Chestnut oak on the West side of a hill. Thence N. 26. W. 38 poles to a Spanish oak thicket on the side of a hill. Thence N. 70. W. 44 poles to a white oak and dogwood by a branch. Thence North 86 poles up the said branch, and binding thereon to a water oak (and two white oaks). Thence N 55. W. 52 poles to a white oak on a steep bank near a small branch. Thence S. 8. W. 60 poles to a Chestnut (and two Chestnut oaks on a ridge). Thence S. 21. E. 90 poles to the beginning with its appurtenances
