E. 94 poles to a white oak on the side of a hill S. 10. E. 52 poles to a hickory sapling on a West hill side, leaving Testerman's lines. N. 87. E. 30 poles to two water oaks & a Chestnut corner to the land of the above named Miles & with said Miles line N. 2. W. 140 poles to the beginning with its appurtenances

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said Tract or Parcel of Land, with its appurtenances, to the said Jackson Reedy and his heirs forever.
