A certain Tract or Parcel of Land, containing One hundred and forty five
acres, part of a Survey of 710 acres made for Griffith
Blickerson, Botetourt County, on the west fork of Little
Horsr including a Survey made for Joseph Clemons,
situated in the County of Montgomery, formerly Botetourt, on the
south fork of Little Horsr, and bounded as followeth to wit
beginning at a red oak corner to Moses Blickerson and with
a line west 60 poles crossing the Horsr to two beech saplings
corner to Wm Morris land and with the line S 40 10 53
poles to a red oak S 63 10 39 pos. to a red oak and cherry
tree saplings at the head of a spring at 27 10 30 pos. to a gum
at 52 10 26 pos. to two beech saplings corner to John Wood's land
and with the line at 33 E 22 pos. to two white oaks E 44 pos. to
a white oak at 36 12 pos. to a double beech on the bank of the river
crossing and down the same 144 pos. to two white walnut saplings
on an Island on Blickerson's line and with two lines S 77 1/2 E 11
pos. to a white oak black oak and red, S 13 E 57 pos. to a white oak S 22 E

Company to take up a Survey of 800,000 acres, under an order of Council,
