That in conformity with a survey made on the *thirteenth* day of *June* one thousand eight hundred and *fifty* by virtue of Land Office Treasury Warrant No. 18580,

there is granted by the said Commonwealth, unto *Peter Reedy,*

a certain Tract or Parcel of Land, containing *Sixty six acres*, lying in Grayson County, on the waters of *Grassy Creek & Little Melton*, (and bounded as follows, viz: Beginning at a white oak in Isaac Reedy's line on a ridge. Thence *N. 40. E. 160 poles*, crossing three branches, to a double chestnut near a large rock. Thence *N. 70. W. 86 poles*, crossing two drains, to a chestnut and two hickories on the side of a hill in Silas Quillin's line, and with the same *S. 10. E. 36 poles* to a large white oak on a ridge; Thence *N. 89. W. 42 poles* to a large chestnut on a high ridge. Thence leaving Quillin's line *S. 70. W. 28 poles* to a water oak on a ridge. Thence *S. 20. W. 44 poles* to a stake in Michael Reedy's line, and with the same *N. 85. E. 26 poles* to a chestnut. Thence *S. 10. W. 38 poles* to a black gum and chestnut oak by some rocks. Thence leaving M. Reedy's line *S. 47. E. 47 poles* to the beginning with its appurtenances

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said Tract or Parcel of Land, with its appurtenances, to the said *Peter Reedy* and his heirs forever.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the said *Joseph Johnson* Esquire, Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia, hath hereunto set his hand and caused the Lesser Seal of the said Commonwealth to be affixed, at Richmond, on the *second* day of *April* in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and *fifty five* and of the Commonwealth the *Seventy ninth*
